Before you Start

Before you start an electrical apprenticeship, you'll need to be employed. The apprenticeship takes around 3 years to complete, and you don't pay for training; also, you can earn while learning.

If you've already achieved the appropriate Level 2 and Level 3 technical knowledge qualifications, these can be used to reduce the apprenticeship duration.

To complete your apprenticeship you'll take the AM2D assessment which tests everything you've learnt during your training.

Once you've passed your End Point Assessment your apprenticeship is complete, and you'll be a qualified domestic electrician.

The achievement of the Domestic Electrician Apprenticeship standard meets the criteria for an ECS Gold card application.
