Use forearm massage techniques (1) to cover a larger surface area of the legs (1) Slightly elevate legs use a bolster under the ankles (1) to aid circulation/lymphatic flow (1). Petrissage movements particularly wringing over the muscular areas (1) to breakdown any tension (1) and drains toxins within the area (1) which will aid circulation (1) and appearance (1). Using the appropriate pre-blend oils (1) to improve sluggish circulation/to warm the area/to help reduce swelling (1). 16	 One mark for identification of each benefit to a maximum of three marks, one mark for any linked explanation to a maximum of six: Stimulates the blood flow to the area (1) which increases nutrients to the area (1). Stimulates the nerve response in the area (1) which causes irritation on the skin surface (1). Softens/ breaks down the hardened tissue (1) helps to disperse fatty deposits (1) and reduces the appearance of cellulite (1). Stirs up the cell contents (1), which aids the dispersal of fluids and toxins (1) and aids the stimulation of metabolism (1). Skin tissue in the localised area is warmed and relaxed (1) which improves the Skin texture and appearance (1). 		6

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	 Stimulates the lymph flow (1) which can help to reduce fluid retention (1). Negatively charged products are pushed into the skin (1) which allows for greater/deeper penetration (1). 		
17	One mark for each of the following, to a maximum of four marks:		4
	 Test the machine prior to use. Keep equipment away from water. Cover/removal of all jewellery. Therapist to place one hand on the area whilst machine is being turned on. Keep in contact with the client during the treatment / do not break contact. Do not touch any conductors whilst the machine is on. Increase current slowly when required during the treatment. Keep in contact with client when turning down and off. Stop treatment if contact is broken. 		
18	One mark for each description of scapula/scoliosis to a maximum of three marks, one mark for any comparison to a maximum of six:		6
	 A client with a winged scapula will present bottom/lower curve of the scapula protrudes/sticks outwards (1) whereas a client with scoliosis will present a spine that has a C or S lateral curve (1). A client with a winged scapula will have a scapula lifts away/protrudes away from the ribs (1) whereas a client with scoliosis will have a displacement / rotation of the rib cage (1). A client with a winged scapula will have a weakness in the serratus anterior muscle (1) whereas a client with scoliosis will have shortening of muscles on one side and lengthening muscles on the opposite side/hips uneven, leg length different or shoulders uneven (1). A client with a winged scapula will have restricted movement in arm/difficulty in punching/pushing/raising the arm up (1) whereas a client with scoliosis may have difficulty bending laterally/ side bending (1). 		

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19	Band 1 (1-5 marks) Treatments proposed are not in a logical sequence, with no account of timing. Treatments proposed are not always suitable to the client and their needs, with no attention paid to, or understanding demonstrated of, the information provided in the case study. Limited treatment options considered, with no justification provided for choices made. Advice and recommendations are general and not tailored to suit the client's needs. No links made between the effects and benefits of treatments and advice, to the client's objectives.	Indicative content Treatment plans. Treatment options. Timescales for treatments. 	To access the higher marks within the band, the candidate has made some attempt to justify their choices made, but this is not always accurate or relevant to the client in the case study.		
Band 2 (6-10 marks) Treatment plan proposed is mostly relevant and accurate. Treatments proposed are in a logical sequence, but timing not always accurate. A range of treatment options are considered but not always meeting the client's objectives. Tentative links between the choices made and the client's needs, but lacks confidence in justifying choices. Advice and recommendations provided on treatments suggested, but lacking future consideration and justification. Conclusion drawn, but does not fully support the treatment plan.			
	To access the higher marks within the band, the candidate has shown greater ability to make links between the choices made and the client's needs. Conclusion made is balanced and supported.		
	Band 3 (11-15 marks) Thorough and comprehensive plan, which is logically sequenced and considers the time available for each part of the treatment plan. Treatment plan and advice provided is accurate and considers the client's needs and characteristics. A wide range of treatment options considered as part of the treatment plan, with detailed and accurate justification for the choices and recommendations made. Candidate makes clear links between effects and benefits of treatments and advice provided, with the objectives of the client and the specific issues identified in the case study. The candidate has		

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	come to a well-balanced conclusion, which is fully substantiated.		
	To access the higher marks within the band, the candidate has given reasons both for and against treatment options considered and any limitations. The candidate has discussed, in detail, further treatments and products which will enhance the overall effectiveness of the treatment plan through link selling.
