Policy background

Ofqual has put in place a new regulatory framework – the VTQ Contingency Regulatory Framework (VCRF). The framework covers certificating and non-certificating students who were expecting to take assessments between 1 August 2020 and 31 August 2021.

The VCRF allows awarding organisations to issue results via alternative arrangements when an exam did not take place and/or when students cannot complete all internal assessments. This includes issuing results based on teachers' judgements of students' performance, to be referred to as Teacher Assessed Grades (TAGs).

Results days will align to the dates for General Qualifications (A levels and GCSEs).

Qualification	Results available on Walled Garden to centres	Results can be released to students
Level 3	Monday, 9 August	Tuesday, 10 August
Level 2	Wednesday, 11 August	Thursday, 12 August



Summary of TAG

Centres should continue the teaching and learning to ensure full coverage of the qualification content as far as is possible, and if it is safe to do so.

For summer 2021 it is a requirement that all results will be submitted through a TAG process.

- 1. Teacher Assessed Grades (TAGs) will be judgements based on the tutor's assessment of the evidence of a student's performance.
- 2. TAGs will be at assessment for each component level e.g. exam and synoptic
- They will be subject to your internal verification and City & Guilds external quality assurance process prior to release of results
- 4. We will support centres throughout to ensure that the process used to determine grades is rigorous and meets our quality assurance requirements see later slides
- 5. A timeline graphic has been published on our website in the Alternative Assessment Arrangements Guide V1.1 March 2021
- 6. The judgement should be based on actual evidence rather than potential performance.

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Differentiating from Centre Assessment Grades (CAGs)

Centres should not make comparisons to the Centre Assessment Grades (CAG) approach adopted last year 2019/20, which were a **prediction** of the grade that students would most likely have achieved had they sat their assessment as normal.

TAGs are different and must be determined based on actual assessment **evidence** covering the knowledge, understanding or skills that would normally have been assessed (i.e. the evidence must be valid for that particular assessment).

Centres should familiarise themselves with the information provided in the guidance document and **not** rely upon last years' experience.





City & Guilds Technical Qualifications 2021 Timeline for Teacher Assessed Grades (TAG)






Friday 21 May – centres are required to submit a form outlining their internal process for TAG (date has been moved and was previously the end of April as you will see).

This document is called the "Centre Policy & Approach" (CPA) form which will be published shortly on our website and where to submit



Teacher Assessed Grades (TAG)

Examination



- The dated spring and summer examinations for 2021 have been cancelled.
- All eligible students will be required to have a result determined for the exam by a TAG.
- We will be providing a suitable resource wb 12th April that can be used by centres to assist with the determination of a TAG

Synoptic assignment

TAGs will be required to be submitted for each assessment component for the qualification, and for each student.

- The synoptic assignment result for 2021 will be determined by a TAG.
- It is strongly advised that the synoptic assessments should continue to be taken as normal or via the published adaptations where it is safe to do so following Public Health guidance. These have all been updated to include task adaptations if required. These can be found on the qualification webpage.
- All College tutors have been previously made aware of this.



Resources to support the Exam TAG process

To determine a TAG, sufficient learning must have been completed.

We will make available wb 12 April a suitable resource/past unseen paper that can be used by centres to assist with the determination of a TAG. This may be taken:

- Supervised conditions (in class or remotely)
- Unsupervised conditions (at home) the centre should ensure authenticity (e.g. through a validation discussion with students, and a signed declaration retained as evidence

Although not compulsory, we strongly recommend that you use this suitable resource as the source to assist in the determination of the TAG. – (note this will be a previous exam paper with marking guide).

Centres should aim for all students in the cohort within your centre to take the sample materials at roughly the same time (to support security of the assessment and hence the strength of the evidence).



Resources to support the TAG process for the Exam

A combination of other evidence can be used alongside the resource provided wb 12th April, **or instead of**, to contribute towards the determination of the exam TAG, such as:

- Results from any completed existing past papers
- Previous examination results, for example any re-sitting students or those with relevant smaller qualifications
- Internal marks for any other centre assessed components that have not been fully completed or submitted
- Any formative or practice exam/assessment results
- Overall student performance
- Coursework/homework
- Internal tutor assessment and progress data
- Any other records of student performance over the course of study.



Using Synoptic Assignments for the TAG process

- The synoptic assignments will provide the best evidence to support the determination of TAGs. All synoptic assignments have been updated to include guidance around individual task adaptations to support their delivery and assessment.
- This guidance can be found at the beginning of the 'Task instructions for centres' section.
- To ensure that evidence produced using synoptic assignments is robust and reliable, we recommend that they are completed under the levels of control detailed in the qualification and/or assessment materials e.g. supervised conditions
- So how are you undertaking the synoptic assignments for 20/21? Business as usual on site OR applying the published task adaptations?




Synoptics – adaptations including publication dates

- We have put in place specific task adaptations that can assist centres in delivering assessments safely and rigorously.
- These can be applied even where TAGs are being used. See the qualification pages on the website:



Synoptics

Centres are advised that teaching, learning and assessment should continue, as far as is possible and if it is safe to do so. Therefore, **completed synoptic assignments (with or without permitted adaptations)** could be used as the sole evidence to form the basis for a TAG.

Where it is not possible to complete the synoptic assignment in full (with or without adaptations) then centres can use a range of evidence that maps clearly to the gaps in the assessment, and this may be evidenced through:

- Formative assessment
- Demonstration and performance of skills-based activities
- Previous/other quals achievement
- Results of any completed optional/mandatory centre-assessments from year one or year two
- Internal marks for centre synoptic assignment tasks that have not been fully completed or moderated
- Internal marks for any other centre assessed components that have not been fully completed or submitted
- Overall student performance
- Classwork/homework
- Internal tutor assessment and progress data
- Any other records of student performance over the course of study

Centres may be required to submit evidence as part of our external quality assurance monitoring and sampling.

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Validation discussions

Some tasks within the synoptic assignment can be taken remotely rather than in supervised conditions.

Where this adaptation is used and where this applies, the assessor should carry out a **validation discussion** with the student to ensure the authenticity of the work.

A **validation discussion** is an example of how centres can ensure the authenticity of evidence produced by students remotely and unsupervised. It may consist of several probing questions to ensure it is the students' own work. This may be along the lines of "how did you come to that...", "why did you take that....". It should not replicate the evidence provided or be taken into consideration as part of the marking/grading process.

The validation discussion does not need to be recorded other than confirmation that the discussion was held and its outcome.

If this applies this is explained in the adaption task guidance.



Employer Involvement & Work Experience

- **Employer Involvement:** The requirement for employer involvement has been relaxed for the period covered by these alternative arrangements. Centres will not need to submit anything to City & Guilds.
- Mandatory work experience requirements have also been waived for this year.
- Please ensure that you have made a booking in Walled Garden for all components, including employer involvement. This will enable us to process the overall qualification and ensure the rules of combination are met.



Bookings

- To be eligible for Teacher Assessed Grades (TAG), students must have a valid registration for the
 qualification you wish to submit the TAG and are due to complete their assessment/qualification
 between 01 August 2020 and 31 August 2021, plus a valid booking on Walled Garden for all relevant
 assessment components (exam, synoptic assignment, centre assessed components and
 employer involvement).
- Centres must check AND ensure all bookings have been made by 30 April 2021. Please don't cancel
 any bookings previously made in Walled Garden, as you'll need these to be able to submit TAGs for
 your students.
- For exam components, any students who were not booked for the Spring exam series should be booked for the Summer exam date if you intend to submit a TAG. Please book the paper version of any dated entry exam, not the e-volve component.
- Please check the rules of combination for the qualification, either in the qualification handbook or on the Walled Garden catalogue for further guidance.



6 steps





Initial review

Identify the teaching, learning and assessment that needs to take place for each student.



Step 2

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Collect evidence

Centres must collect evidence of student performance to support determination of TAGs.



Step 3

Evaluate the quality of evidence

Centres must consider the quality and subsequent weighting of evidence.



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Step 6

Submission to City & Guilds

A sample of evidence will be required for the exam and synoptic assignment.

We'll provide more detail on this process in due course.



Internal Quality Assurance

Centres must ensure that TAGs are subject to internal quality assurance. They must also be signed off by the head of centre.



Step 4

Assign grades

When sufficient evidence has been gathered and evaluated, tutors will be asked to make a judgement of each student's performance based on the range of evidence.
