City & Guilds is working hard to get definitive guidance from the various regulatory bodies in England and across the developed nations, as well as the Department of Education in each country. FLASH UPDATE 10

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Newsletter, we have no other Adaptation of assessment options other than those published in October 2020. We know this is not ideal and we wish to provide greater flexibility around what can be done but need permission from those who regulate qualifications.

Scope of learners

The adaptations are ONLY available to learners undertaking their assessment in the UK or the Republic of Ireland, scheduled to complete their qualification or assessments during the 2020/21 academic year. These adaptions **do not apply** to International or End-point Assessment products.

Applying Adaptations

If you need to use the adaptation then you need to inform us that you are going to do so, when you get to the Adaption webpage you will be able to locate the form.

Post 5 January 2021 – to time of writing

- Apprenticeship Standards: EPA still operating, on-programme move to remote (some good news later)
- Technicals: Waiting on Ofqual and DfE to state what they will allow and any further flexibility we can put in place
- Credit based: Adaptations are in place, regulatory bodies and individual Government education departments being consulted on extensions and more flexible.



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
Microsoft Teams – use for Remote Invigilation

The Government has issued some updates to documents concerning Apprenticeships, the documents are listed in the table with the relevant link. Please note that these may change in the current circumstances and are provided on the bases that you check these as the Covid lockdown rules change.

Revised Standards development

Currently the following revised Standards are under way:

- Infrastructure Communications Technician, which will replace the Infrastructure Technician and Unified Communications Technician. It will have 3 pathways.
- Software Developer
- Network Engineer
- Data Analyst, which is going for quality check of the Project outlines developed for the new Assessment Plan

While the new Standards are schedule to be released around the end of February, we will be looking to open these products for Registration around the end of April to beginning of May. At this time we should have outline handbooks and project requirements in place, with EPA first booking being open by September 2020 though we know that we will not see any EPA activity until early 2022.

Digital Marketer

The redevelopment and consultation by employers on this is still on-going, as IfATE think it should be part of a Marketing Standard (which would need rewriting) rather than a stand-alone Standard. This is being challenged by the Employer Group and discussions have taken place with various other employers, as well as the Digital Marketing Institute that has thousands of members that can attest to the fact this is a job.

Some concern is around the attractiveness of the Apprentice title, Digital Marketer versus Marketing Assistant. We also know that this product has seen a much more even gender split that we have seen in other digital areas and in marketing.

Credit based qualification

To enable you to offer a better Software Developer Traineeship for 16-19 or 19+ AEB, we are getting the generic language units put into the 7540-12/-13 and 4520-02/-03 qualifications. We will also include a unit on Planning a development and one on Data manipulation.

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Digital credentials – on-programme



Don't forget that your apprentice can now get Digital Credentials for the on-programme qualifications of Standards (where relevant) and for the Apprenticeship overall. We need their

email address in order to be able to send them the link and put them onto the Acclaim portal to access the "badges". These can be shared on social media, email signatures and in CVs, where anyone can click on them and see the competency that the apprentice now has.

We are also looking for sponsors for the badges. This does not require any monetary commitment, just that they check the content



and would be happy to have us place a statement on they badge content to state they recognize the credential and what has been learnt being appropriate to the job role stated.

While we have approached some large organisations and membership bodies, we do not have a preference and this could provide an extra means to get an organization some soft marketing.

Any candidates, let us know.

EPA and Functional Skills

The Department for Education (DfE) and the Education and Skills Funding Agency (ESFA) have recently published updated guidance on the delivery of apprenticeships and Functional Skills assessments in light of the new lockdown restrictions.

The guidance covers some key areas such as the extensions to apprenticeships flexibilities until 31 August 2021 from the Institute of Apprenticeships and Technical Education and Functional Skills requirements (please see pages 15/16 in the link below).

We hope that this guidance is useful and we are also continually updating our <u>EPA FAQ page</u> that will reflect the latest updates.
