

Booking and assessment

Deadlines for booking summer exam series


The results of the first spring exam series will be available from Tuesday 23 April, results of the second spring exam series will be available from Monday 13 May and the 8202 Electrical spring results will be available from Monday 20 May. If you need to book your learners for a re-take (or a first attempt on the summer series), you must do this by Friday 26 April (for May exams), Friday 17 May (for June exams) and Friday 24 May (for 8202 Electrical exams). It is important that you have made all the correct bookings for your learners. Incorrect bookings will delay the marking and moderation process and may result in learners not being certificated in August.

Remember you need to ensure that a booking is made for every candidate against all relevant components of the Technical Qualification. If you need to make additional bookings, please ensure that these are completed prior to this deadline.

Changes to how you will receive the results breakdown and grade boundary analysis

For the past two academic years, in addition to the release of candidate grades on Walled Garden, we have provided centres a breakdown of their candidate results and the associated boundary marks (pass, merit and distinction) for the Technical Qualification assessments via email.

However, in order to comply with GDPR, we can no longer provide this data via email. This year you will be able to view candidates' grade and assessment results and download it directly from Walled Garden.

There will also be an option to download to your preferred location and then use our new **Grade Boundary Analysis Tool** to import the data and carry out additional analysis of your candidate results.

In April you will be able to access our helpful guide which talks you through how to locate and download the candidate grades and marks from Walled Garden. It will also show you how to use the new Grade Boundary Analysis tool. You can find everything you need on our <u>resources and support page</u>, under the new 'Results and grades tools' accordion. Our Technicals and Moderation Support team will send out a detailed update later in the month and will be on hand to support you with this change.

City & Guilds grade prediction calculator


Our brand new **grade prediction calculator** is designed for centres delivering City & Guilds Technical Qualifications.

The grade prediction calculator allows you to do two things:

- 1. You can enter marks and grade boundaries, shared by City & Guilds at the end of each exam series window, and the calculator will show you the aggregated qualification grade a candidate would achieve, including any relevant UCAS points (assuming the candidate has achieved all the requirements of the rules of combination).
- 2. Based on a candidate's achievement in year one of a two-year qualification, you can enter predicted assessment grades for any remaining year two assessments, and the grade prediction calculator will tell you what qualification grade a candidate would achieve (assuming the candidate has achieved all the requirements of the rules of combination).

The grade prediction calculator comes in form of a spreadsheet, which you can freely download and use. Guidance on how to use the calculator is contained within the spreadsheet itself. <u>You can download the grade prediction calculator here</u>.

Moderation support

Moderation visits

For those synoptic assignments requiring a moderation visit, allocated moderators should have now contacted you to agree visit dates. A full list of qualifications requiring moderation visits is now available <u>here</u>. If you are delivering any of these and have not yet heard from a moderator, please contact the Technicals and Moderation Support team as soon as possible.

Moderation Portal

The Moderation Portal, our online administration platform used to submit marks, grades and evidence for the synoptic assignment, centre-assessed components and Employer Involvement requirement will be available to centres soon.

We will inform all centres as soon as the system goes live and provide login details. Our updated centre guidance will be available shortly and we will be holding networking events to support your staff in using the Moderation Portal. Invitations to these events will be sent by the Technicals and Moderation Support team.

Moderation Portal submission dates and requirements

The following section is a reminder of the various Technical Qualification components that must be uploaded to the Moderation Portal along with the submission dates.

• Synoptic assignments

Friday 17 May 2019 is the deadline for uploading marks and evidence for synoptic assignments to the Moderation Portal. Centres submitting later than this date run the risk of delays to the release of their results. Qualification specific recording forms are found under the relevant qualification webpage.

Centre-assessed components (including optional units)

For centre-assessed components (e.g. optional units), the deadline for submitting evidence for these components is **Friday 14 June 2019.** However, once the Moderation Portal is made available, we encourage centres to upload their grades and sample evidence where these are completed earlier. This gives the opportunity for early feedback and improvement actions (if required) to be provided to the centre, giving more time to act on them.



• Employer Involvement requirement

For all Key Stage 5 Technical Qualifications, centres must arrange for learners to undertake sufficient meaningful Employer Involvement activities to meet the requirement. We have produced the following resources to support centres:

The deadline for submitting evidence for these components to the Moderation Portal is **Friday 14 June 2019.**

Moderation centre support materials

There is a range of useful guidance documents and resources available to support the moderation process for Technical Qualifications.

As well as our <u>Marking and Moderation Centre Guide</u>, which all centre staff involved in the delivery and assessment of the qualifications must familiarise themselves with, we have created a number of recorded webinars to support centres. These include;

- **Guide to synoptic assessment**, four bite-size audio presentations led by one of City & Guilds Principal Moderators, aiming to guide and support centres in the delivery, evidence collection and marking of the synoptic assessments.
- **Qualification-specific marking and standardisation support webinars** delivered by Principal Moderators. These give an overview of the synoptic assignment, provide examples of high and lower achieving candidate work, look at the marking process and share best practice for centre quality assurance and marker standardisation.
