



Stage 2: it's good to share...

Staff directly involved in the assessment and internal quality assurance (IQA) of Functional Skills familiar with changes and likely implications for their practice.			
Staff involved in the delivery of GCSE English and Mathematics understand the changes to Functional Skills, and how this might affect the relationship between Functional Skills and GCSE.			
Staff involved in the administration of Functional Skills (eg exams staff) aware of changes, and possible implications for their role.			
Staff responsible for the teaching/assessment of other subjects delivered alongside Functional Skills have a good understanding of the reforms and possible implications for their practice.			
Senior leaders have a good understanding of the Functional Skills reforms, especially any resourcing and/or programme planning implications.

Implications of any changes to assessment duration .			
Implications of non-calculator section of FS Mathematics assessment.			City & Guilds will set out the operational model for the calculator/non-calculator sections of its FS Mathematics assessments once this has been confirmed with Ofqual.
Implications for spell/grammar checkers and dictionaries no longer being permitted within FS English Writing.			
Changes to format of FS English Speaking, Listening and Communication (SLC) assessments.			
Any operational implications for Entry level assessments – eg word lists within FS English.


Stage 4: planning and implementation



Things to consider	All clear, understood and actioned?	Need more information, or more to do?	Comments
Accessing key documents to support the reformed Functional Skills qualifications (once available) from City & Guilds.			City & Guilds intends publish its handbook and other documentation relating to the reformed Functional Skills qualifications in early 2019.
Implications for Apprenticeships , eg programme hours, ensuring qualifications achieved/attempted as necessary prior to Gateway.			
Implications for Study Programmes , eg programme hours, condition of funding rules, meaningful progression.			
Briefings and CPD support in place for staff, to ensure all understand changes and implications for their practice.			
Building on existing good practice – eg experience of embedded/contextualised teaching of maths and English.			
Changes relationship between Functional Skills and GCSE understood – appropriate decisions taken regarding use of each.			
Relationship between Functional Skills and 'bite-sized' maths and English qualifications (eg City & Guilds' Mathematics/English Skills (3847) suite) understood; appropriate decisions taken about their use.			


