Q. Do I need to do all the writing assignments in one sitting?

No, In accordance with the Assessor Pack that accompanies each live assessment, you can conduct the assessments over more than one occasion.

Candidates may stop at the end of any activity, but are not permitted to take any work away with them and if assessments are run over more than one session, these **must be** consecutive with **no** teaching or preparation in between.


The time allowance set out in the assessor pack must be adhered to regardless of whether the assessment is taken over one or multiple sessions.



What is the difference between an interlocutor and assessor?

- An interlocutor is responsible for facilitating discussions with the candidate during Speaking & Listening assessments.
- An Assessor is responsible for making assessment decisions for each candidate
- These two roles should be carried out by different people, with both present in the room while Speaking & Listening assessments take place.
- However, it is permitted for the same person to carry out both roles, provided that they are not acting as both Interlocutor and Assessor simultaneously





Document headings - Reading assessments

Should titles, sub titles and headings have capital letters at the beginning of each word, or should they only have a capital at the beginning?

- Either approach to a heading or title is acceptable
- In our Reading assessments you will see both forms of titles
- The key thing for candidates to remember, is that proper nouns always start with a capital letter


