- 13 The information given in the table below is a case study of a client who has come to the salon for a range of treatments for her 60th birthday party. The client has booked in for two treatment sessions, one the day before and one on the morning of her party.

Client:	Pam Smith is a very active sixty-year-old, attending yoga twice a week and a keep fit class once a week.
Medical History	Has dietary controlled diabetes and monitors closely what she eats.
Physical observations:	<p>Skin analysis: Dry skin with wrinkles and fine lines around the eye and forehead area. Milia visible around the eye area.</p> <p>Hand and nail condition: Cuticles dry and some pigmentation patches on the hands.</p> <p>Foot and nail condition: Cuticles dry and cracked, areas of hard skin around each heel. Suffers with poor circulation and oedema.</p>

Discuss the treatment options available recommending a justified treatment plan for each of the treatment sessions.
