




5528-365 – Level 3 Legal Aspects of Medical Administration Examiner's report – June 2017







Areas of good performance

Only one paper was submitted for this qualification and this was of basic standard.

The candidate gave basic information for the majority of the questions and showed some understanding of the topics questioned in the paper.

The candidate showed good understanding of CQC (Q1) and explained their responsibilities well. The responsibilities of the Occupational Therapist (Q3) were also described well. The candidate has a good understanding of the NHS complaints procedure (Q15) and explained the process in a clear way.

The majority of answers were basic. At this level the candidates should show more understanding and in depth knowledge of legal aspects of the NHS.

Areas for improvement

(Q5) was very poor and the candidate could not describe the sections of the Mental Health Act. An incorrect answer was given for (Q7)

(Q9) The candidate identified the types of consent but then mixed up the explanations for each type.

Recommendations and Tips

Candidates should read the questions carefully to ensure they are giving the correct information as asked for in the question. When a question asks for a description then more information should be given than a simple one or two word answer.
