AMSPAR was founded in 1964 and, since then, has been supporting and representing those members of staff working in the non-clinical side of the health sector. Initially this was Medical Secretaries but we have broadened our membership to include Practice Managers and Receptionists due to demand. We liaise with numerous other organisations such as the National Association of Primary Care (NAPC), The Royal College of General Practitioners (RCGP) and provide representatives to sit on various working bodies set up by the Department of Health and other NHS bodies.

AMSPAR wishes to support in full the submission of the above qualification.

The NHS employs 1.4m people in the UK and a further 0.4 are estimated to work in the sector. The roles and job titles are too numerous to mention. However, the breadth of the above qualification provides a solid grounding for the student embarking on a career in the field. It enables them to learn and develop skills necessary for both the work place and further education. In addition to this the qualification contains units such as 223 (Working in the NHS) which assists the learner in understanding the continuing changing framework of the NHS, how it operates and the obligations of those working in the service and the individual.
