OVERVIEW

What does this qualification cover?

This qualification covers a wide range of topics directly related to the knowledge and skills needed to work with children and will provide learners with the key principles, values and skills for caring for children.

The units cover the following areas:

- Growth and development of young children
- Sharing learning experiences with children
- Human growth and development
- Respecting and valuing children
- Children's play and leisure activities in the community
- Preparing for your next steps
- Supporting babies to play
- Craft activities for young children
- Science activities for young children
- Technology activities for young children
- Musical activities for young children
- Practical health and safety when with young children
- Finding out about Forest Schools
- Understanding learning and development through play
- Exploring a vocational area for own development
- Self development
- Healthy eating for families
- Confidence building for the young child through play

All learners are asked to complete a number of credits by choosing from a range of 17 units. This will account for around 70% of the vocational learning needed. They will then have free choice when it comes to optional units needed to achieve the total number of credits. This will provide them with 30% of the vocational learning needed to complete the Diploma and progress onto further learning.

This is a framework qualification.







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• Who is this qualification designed for?

This qualification is specifically designed for candidates who want to work in childcare, with an expectation that their choice of units will help them develop the knowledge and skills required by this sector. They may have completed the Award or Certificate and are using the Diploma to top up the learning, allowing them to explore and develop their understanding of specialist childcare related area, such as supporting children's play and creativity, as well as healthy eating, physical activity and self development.

The qualification is suitable for learners who are at least 16 years old.

Learners should select the Diploma if they wish to gain a broader knowledge of childcare sector. They may have completed the Award or Certificate and feel that they are not yet ready to progress to Level 2 and they want to explore some key areas in detail.
