<u>OVERVIEW</u>

• What does this qualification cover?

This qualification covers a very wide range of areas related to the skills and knowledge required for preparing learners who want to obtain the skills as a basic designer maker in a variety of different craft areas.

They allow learners to learn, develop and practice the creative skills required for career progression in the craft Industry.

The following areas that can be covered within this qualification:

- Design ideas and sampling techniques for 2D and 3D work
- Create life drawings
- Scenic painting
- Still life painting techniques
- Printmaking techniques
- Computer generated black and white Imagery
- Creative typography and calligraphy
- Creating rings with multiple settings
- Making brooches
- Creating sculptured items
- Making wooden artefacts
- Produce oil and water gild items.
- Innovative basketry items
- Warm and cool glass techniques

All learners will cover the mandatory core unit, covering exploring design ideas and sampling techniques. The choice of optional units will allow the learner to experience different 2D and 3D techniques.









This qualification is suitable for those wanting to develop their understanding of the industry. The Certificate-sized qualification in 2D and 3D allows learners to study creative techniques in-depth as part of a broad programme of study that could include related disciplines. It also allows learners to progress, through appropriate further learning, to specialist creative roles such as a technician in an art department of a college, an assistant visual display designer, or an assistant sign writer.
