About this document

This assignment comprises part of the assessment for Level 2 Create software components using C# (7266/7267-206).

Time allowance: 4 hours

Assignment set up:

This assignment is made up of **two** tasks

- Task A Create software from a given design specification
- Task B Test the software and produce documentation

Scenario

You work as a software developer for Fremantle Solutions a company which develops software. You have been asked to create and test software for an order calculator.

The software will include the following functionality:

- entry of a product code and quantity for each item on an order
- lookup of the related product description and price
- calculation of each line total, the subtotal, discount and order total
- display of the total value of orders entered.

Task A

In this task you are required to create software to provide calculation of an order.

- 1 Save the project at regular intervals as you work through the task. Save the form as frmOrder and the Project as OrderCalc.
- 2 No variables in the class, for the form, should be declared as public and where possible variables should be declared locally within a function.

frmOrder

Create a form to appear similar to the form shown above as follows:

- add a Label for the heading with the Text property set to Order Calculator and the font set to Arial, Bold and a larger size.
- add a Label with the Text property set to Product Code
- add four TextBoxes for entry of the product code
- add a Label with the Text property set to Description
- add four TextBoxes to display the product description with the Enabled property of each of these TextBoxes set to False
- add a Label with the Text property set to Quantity
- add four TextBoxes for entry of the product quantity
- add a Label with the Text property set to Price
- add four TextBoxes to display the product price with the Enabled property of each of these TextBoxes set to False
- add a Label with the Text property set to Total
- add seven TextBoxes to display the totals with the Enabled property of each of these TextBoxes set to False
- add three Labels with the Text property set to SubTotal, Discount and Order Total.
- the font for all the labels should be set to Bold.
- add a menu with four menu options named mnuOrder, mnuCalculate, mnuClear and mnuExit with their Text properties set to Order, Calculate, Clear and Exit.
- add shortcut keys for the Calculate, Clear and Exit menu options
- add two buttons named btnCalculate and btnClear with their Text properties set to Calculate and Clear
- the TabIndex property should be set so that the user enters a product code and quantity for the first line then for the next line and so on
- the background colour of the form set to a light green
- the StartPosition property of the form set to CenterScreen.
- 4 Set the Text property of the form frmOrder to: Orders *your name* and today's date

- 5 Declare single dimension arrays, within the class, to hold the data for the product code, product description and product price for FIVE products.
- 6 Write code so that when the form is loaded the appropriate data is stored, in the arrays, for the FIVE products listed below:
 - 3115 USB Scanner 49.99
 - 3116 Monitor 17 159.99
 - 3117 Mono Laser Printer 129.99
 - 3118 LCD/TV Monitor 19 319.99
 - 3119 Colour Laser Printer 349.99
- 7 Write code for the Clear button to clear all the text boxes on the form.
- 8 Write code for the Calculate button to
 - display the product description for each product code that has been entered
 - display the product price for each product code that has been entered
 - display each line total if a product code and quantity have been entered for that line
 - display the subtotal for each line total
 - display a discount of 10% if the subtotal is greater than 5000 otherwise the discount is 0 $\,$
 - display the total for the order after subtracting the discount from the subtotal
 - add the order total to an accumulated total of orders
 - display all prices and totals as currency to two decimal places
 - use error handling to trap any errors and display an appropriate message if an error occurs.
- 9 Write code for the mnuCalculate menu option to perform the click action of the button btnCalculate.
- 10 Write code for the mnuClear menu option to perform the click action of the button btnClear.
- 11 Write code for the Exit menu option that displays a message to the user to show the total amount of orders e.g. 'Total amount of order = £nnnnn.nn' and then terminates the software.

Task B

In this task you are required to test the software and produce documentation.

- 1 Create test data and expected results. Test the software and compare the expected results to the actual results and correct any errors found.
- 2 Create or locate the EXE file and demonstrate that the software works correctly.
- 3 Produce a program listing of the code for the software.
- 4 Produce a screen print of the form frmOrder while the software is running

Candidates should check that the software produced meets the following criteria.

- 5 The software conforms to the design specification.
- 6 The code of the program is commented.
- 7 Meaningful names are used for constants, variables, and controls using a consistent naming convention.

Note

- Candidates should produce the following for their assessor:
 - a printed program listing
 - screen print of the form frmOrder
- Ensure that your name is on all documentation
- If the assignment is taken over more than one period, all paperwork must be returned to the test supervisor at the end of each sitting.
