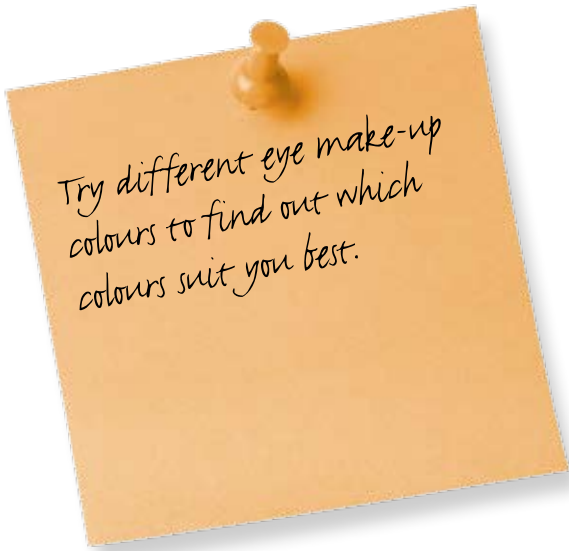

Some useful words are explained below

Colour spectrum

Red, orange, yellow, green, blue and violet.



Complementary colours

Colours that go together well.



Secondary colours

Violet, orange and green.

Mood board

A collection of all your first ideas. It could include examples of hair colour, make-up looks, accessories and materials or clothes.



Primary colours

Blue, red and yellow.



Total look

In the hair and beauty industry this includes hair, make-up and clothes.

Many people believe that colours can show your personality. Do you think that this is true? Do confident people wear bright colours?

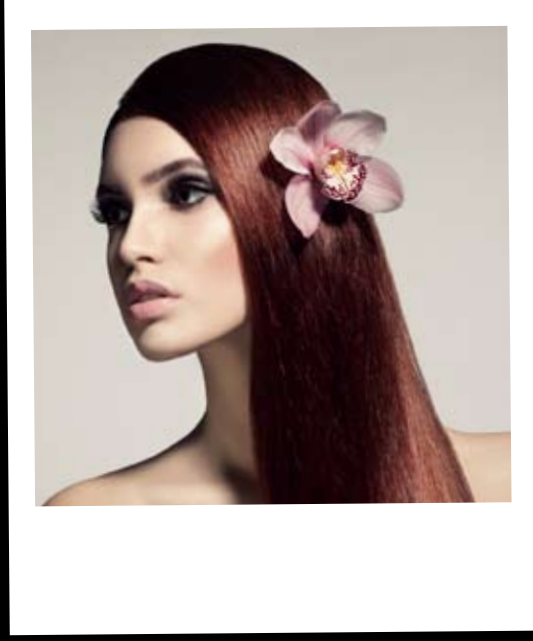
