#### Evidence requirements

#### What you must do

You must practically demonstrate in your everyday work that you have met the standard for providing hair and scalp treatments. Your assessor will observe your performance on at least **four** occasions on different clients, one of which must be treating a scaling scalp and another for diffuse hair loss.

Simulation is not allowed for any performance evidence within this unit. Although some evidence of your performance will be gathered from the observations made by your assessor, it is likely you will need to assemble relevant documentary evidence in your portfolio to meet the requirements of standard and qualification.

# Maintain effective and safe methods of working when providing hair and scalp treatments

- a Ensure your client's clothing is effectively protected throughout the treatment
- b Position your client to meet the needs of the treatment without causing them discomfort
- c Ensure your own posture and position whilst working minimises fatigue and the risk of injury
- d Keep your work area clean and tidy throughout the treatment
- e Remove waste immediately at the end of the treatment
- f Use working methods that
  - minimise the wastage of **treatment**products
  - minimise the risk of cross-infection
  - make effective use of your working time
  - ensure the use of clean resources
  - minimise the risk of harm or injury to yourself and others
  - minimise the risk of damage to **tools and**equipment
- g Ensure your personal standards of health and hygiene minimise the risk of cross-infection, infestation and offence to your clients and colleagues
- h Wear suitable personal protective equipment as required
- i Adopt a positive, polite and reassuring manner towards the client throughout the treatment
- j Ensure the client is in a comfortable and relaxed position throughout the treatment
- k Ensure all **tools and equipment** are cleaned using the correct methods

- I Ensure the treatment is cost effective and is carried out within a commercially viable time
- m Ensure client consultation records are up-todate, accurate, complete, legible and signed by yourself and the client
- n Ensure that informed and signed legal guardian consent is obtained for minors, prior to the treatment \*


