Q10	Response covers a narrow range of considerations, with little or no reference to the implications on the achievability of the hair and beard services. Tenuous links to use of products, cutting tools and techniques and their suitability are evident/loosely linked to the overall style achievability. To access higher marks in the band, the response will contain some relevant points and appropriate action. Examples will be limited with little or no justification. Band 2 (5 – 8 marks) The response makes a reasonable attempt to cover the main considerations and implications of the achievability of the style and some justifications. Discussion is mostly relevant and likely to be detailed in some areas more than others; reference to consultation considerations, products, hair and beard services, tools and equipment, techniques and adjustments to the services may be made to address issues. Clear knowledge of topics is evident although linkages between these may be fragmented and lack coherency. Discussion recommendations and opinions are offered with use of some examples in parts; content is mostly factually accurate. The overall discussion is presented in a reasonably clear format and the use of terminology is appropriate. To access higher marks in the band, the discussion will generally be detailed and contain relevant justifications. The overall discussion is presented clearly and with some logical structure.	Indicative content: Candidate discussion may include, but not be limited to the following: Consultation considerations and possible implications that may impact on the service, with reference to: Client requirements, suitability, achievability, costs, time, maintenance Hair analysis: hair length, hair condition; growth patterns; hair classification – type 1, characteristics; possible adverse hair conditions and influencing factors, including hair texture, density, condition, (possibly dry) alopecia areata Skin analysis: look for signs of any additional adverse skin conditions and contraindications, skin and scalp conditions (eg dry flaky & sensitive skin. Facial hair length for the beard cut Client understanding / satisfaction: Exploration and recommendations for current look taking into consideration head and face shape, change of style, influencing factors. A comprehensive discussion which incorporates the relevant consultation considerations and their impact on the service; comparisons are drawn on the effects and limitations for a wide range of products, cutting and shaving tools and equipment and techniques including reference to credible adaptations and suitability.
