The Hairdressing Council was set up in 1964 by an Act of Parliament. This means that hairdressers and barbers can apply to become State Registered in the same way as doctors, dentists or nurses can. The only difference is that it is completely voluntary to belong to the UK Register of qualified hairdressers and barbers.

The Hairdressing Council believes in the professionalism and passion of hairdressing and barbering and its campaign is to raise standards, making the industry self-regulated.

We would like to provide our support to City & Guilds, as a Professional Body within the Hairdressing & Barbering industry, we feel the following qualification is suitable for a young person between the ages of 16-19 studying full time and will give that young person an advantage when going onto applying for a job or progressing onto an apprenticeship or further learning.

Level 2 Technical Certificate in Hairdressing

We believe this qualification is suitable for someone wanting to work as a Stylist and as such is recognised by the industry.

As a qualified Stylist the industry will require that all the necessary level 2 skills are covered. The following qualification allows the learner to gain these essential skills and knowledge in order to progress onto an Apprenticeship or into employment.

We believe that the following practical skills and knowledge would give a young person an advantage when seeking employment and are essential for a new employee in the role of a Stylist.

Skills and knowledge include:

- Principles of practice of hairdressing
- Shampoo, condition and treat the hair and scalp
- Style, set and dress hair
- Cut hair using basic techniques
- Colour and lighten hair

We feel that once the learner has gained this qualification which covers a sound understanding and key practical skills for the Hairdressing industry they could take the position as a:

- Stylist in a Salon
