OVERVIEW	
What does this qualification cover?	The City & Guilds Level 4 in Independent Advocacy Practice is a competence based qualification which means that it covers the knowledge and skills that are required to work in a particular job role, in this case as an independent advocate. This means that you must be working in a role where you will be responsible for providing independent advocacy to an individual in either a statutory or non-statutory independent advocate role.
	This qualification consists of 3 mandatory units covering core knowledge and skills competencies required by all independent advocates. The mandatory units include:
	 the core legislation and policy drivers which an independent advocate needs to understand and work to.
	 what is meant by entitlements to independent advocacy, and
	 the skills required to demonstrate competence within the independent advocacy role.
	The different contexts in which independent advocates may work are covered by the optional unit content. This includes working with adults, children and young people, mental health, mental capacity or specifically concerning complaints

advocacy.

Learners must complete the THREE mandatory units and ONE optional unit to gain the full qualification.

The assessment of the qualification mostly takes place in your real work environment whilst you carry out the day to day activities of your job. This means that you are also proving you work to a nationally recognised level at the same time as doing your job.

Why choose this qualification over similar qualifications?

This qualification is ideal for you if you are working as an independent advocate and wish to develop your skills and knowledge to a level which demonstrates that you are competent.

Delivery of the qualification can be flexible to meet your needs and assessment usually takes place in your place of work.
