

Declared Purpose:

The following purpose is for the Level 2 Diploma in Health and Social Care (Adults) for England QAN: 501/1306/9

Who is this qualification for?	This qualification is for you if you want to progress in a career in health and social care working with adults. There are no previous qualifications required but you must be 16 years of age or older.
You will then need to decide where you want to focus, as you will need to choose from three pathways: generic, dementia or learning disability pathway. Optional subjects include: • infection control and prevention • personalisation in health and social care • Independent Advocacy • working with individuals with dementia • communication with individual of dementia • working with individuals with learning disabilities • administration of medicines • food safety and nutrition for heath and social care • end of life care principles.	
Colleges and training providers work with employers in order to maximise the value of your experience. Where possible employers will offer work experience placements to allow you to put into context what you are learning.	
Will the qualification lead to employment, and if so, in which job role and at what level?	The qualification will provide you with the practical skills and knowledge enabling you to gain employment or progress in the health and social sector working with adults. There are a number of jobs available: • care assistants/support workers/key workers in residential settings • healthcare assistants / support workers in community and primary care environments
