OVERVIEW

- What does this qualification cover?

This qualification covers a range of topics directly related to the knowledge and skills needed to work in health and social care, with adults.

Mandatory areas covered are:

The wide range of optional units will allow them to cover areas such as:

All learners will complete the mandatory units and then a selection of optional units, allowing them to tailor their learning and acquire specific knowledge and skills, appropriate to the setting where they work and to their job role.

This qualification is specifically designed for learners who work in health and social care in adult settings and want to develop skills and knowledge in order to demonstrate their competence in their role.

This qualification is for learners who are at least 18 years old. There are no formal entry requirements for learners but centres must ensure that learners have the skills, potential and opportunity to gain the qualification successfully.
