The following purpose is for the Level 2 Certificate in Healthcare Support Services QAN: 501/2124/8

Who is this qualification for?	This qualification is for you if you want to progress in a career in healthcare support, in a non-clinical role.
	There are no previous qualifications required but you must be 16 years of age or older.
What does the qualification cover?	 You will need to complete five compulsory areas: introduction to personal development in health, social care or children's and young people's settings introduction to communication in health, social care or children's and young people's settings introduction to equality and inclusion in health, social care or children's and young people's settings introduction to equality and inclusion in health, social care or children's and young people's settings the role of the health and social care worker contribute to health and safety in health and social care.
	 You will then need to choose from a wide range of optional subjects , which include: first aid essentials the principles of infection prevention and control and causes and spread of infection principles of safeguarding and protection in health and social care team work management of own performance service improvement in healthcare removal, cleaning and storage of linen deep cleaning of surfaces and areas collection and delivery of mail transporting, moving and assisting individuals records confidentiality customer service principles, presentation and appointments.
	Colleges and training providers work with employers in order to maximise the value of your experience. Where possible employers will offer work experience placements to allow you to put into context what you are learning.
