0066 Level 3 Diploma in Work-based Agriculture 500/6224/4

OVERVIEW

- What does this qualification cover?

This qualification covers a very wide range of areas related to the skills and knowledge required for working in the Agricultural industry.

All learners will cover the mandatory core units of:

- Promote, monitor and maintain health, safety and security
- Communicate information within the workplace
- Maintain and store records within the workplace

You can then take optional units that are relevant to your chosen pathway; Crop Production, Mixed Farming, Livestock Production or Poultry Production.

The choice of optional units will reflect the work environment that you are in, and the type of role that you are carrying out. There are a wide range of optional units, but examples include Establish, monitor and maintain appropriate conditions for livestock, Establish, monitor and maintain site hygiene and bio-security, Plan, introduce and evaluate livestock accommodation, Prepare, monitor and maintain the milking of livestock, Monitor and maintain the preparation, loading and incubation of eggs, Monitor and maintain soil nutrition for grassland and forage crops, Identify the need for and plan habitat management work, Implement a marketing plan.

This is a Framework qualification.

- Who could take this qualification? OR who is this qualification designed for?

This qualification is part of the Apprenticeship in Agriculture, or it may be taken as a stand alone qualification.

It is a work-related, competence-based qualification, and is designed for someone in work or who wishes to progress into work. It reflects the skills and knowledge needed to do a job effectively, and shows that you are competent in the area of work the qualification represents. The qualification may allow you to combine working for an Agricultural business, such as a Beef or Sheep unit, Poultry enterprise, or Arable farm, and typically involves you attending one day a week at College or with a Training Provider.

There are no specific prior achievements required to take this qualification, but a Level 2 qualification in Agriculture or other Land-based related subjects could be an advantage. You need to be 16 years old or over to take this qualification.

WHAT COULD THIS QUALIFICATION LEAD TO?

This qualification could lead to jobs such as:

- Assistant Farm Manage
- Arable Foreman
- Herdsperson
- Hatchery Manager
- Farm Secretary

You could progress to other qualifications at Level 3 such as:

Level 3 Certificate in Agriculture
Level 3 Subsidiary Diploma in Agriculture
Level 3 90 Credit Diploma in Agriculture
Level 3 Diploma in Agriculture
Level 3 Extended Diploma in Agriculture

There is an Award and a Certificate in Level 3 Work-based Agriculture which you could choose to take, which are similar to the Diploma, but smaller in size.

However, if you want to do an Apprenticeship at Level 3, you must take the Diploma qualification.
