Q9	<p>For no awardable content, award 0 marks.</p> <p>Band 1: 1-3 marks A limited range of considerations with a mostly descriptive answer showing clear gaps in knowledge and limited understanding. Candidate attempts to use technical terminology infrequently but mostly inaccurately.</p> <p>To access the higher marks in the band, the candidate demonstrates a wider range of considerations with superficial explanations, which may not all be valid. An attempt to provide some examples may be evident but may not be relevant.</p> <p>Band 2: 4-6 marks Candidate considered a range of aspects of the topic with a clear discussion showing knowledge and understanding with some gaps. Technical terminology is used frequently with some inaccuracies.</p> <p>To access the higher marks in the band, discussion is supported with relevant examples with developed and valid links to the topic, including some justifications.</p> <p>Band 3: 7-9 marks Candidate considered a wide range of aspects of the topic with a comprehensive discussion showing thorough knowledge and understanding.
