### OVERVIEW

- What does this qualification cover?

This qualification covers a range of areas related to the skills and knowledge required for working in the Environmental Conservation industry. All learners will cover the mandatory core units of:

Monitoring and maintaining health and safety  
Maintain and develop personal performance  
Establish and maintain effective working relationships with others  
Maintain environmental good practice

You can then take optional units that are relevant to the chosen pathway of interest in:

- Environmental Conservation
- Access and recreation
- Rivers, coasts and waterways

Optional units could include:

Conduct and report on a field survey for habitat types  
Monitor and report on water levels  
Collect, sort and process materials for recycling  
Promote responsible public use of the environment.

The choice of optional units will reflect the work environment that you are in, and the type of role that you are carrying out.

This is a Framework qualification.

- Who could take this qualification? OR who is this qualification designed for?

It is a work-related, competence-based qualification, and is designed for someone in work or who wishes to progress into work. It reflects the skills and knowledge needed to do a job effectively, and shows that you are competent in the area of work the qualification represents.

The qualification may allow you to combine working for an Environmental business, such as a Wildlife Trust, conservation trust or similar job, and typically involves you attending one day a week at College or with a Training Provider.

There are no specific prior achievements required to take this qualification, but a Level 1 or another Level 2 qualification in other Land-based related subjects could be an advantage.

You need to be 16 years old or over to take this qualification.

### WHAT COULD THIS QUALIFICATION LEAD TO?

This qualification could lead to jobs such as:

- Estate worker
- Ranger
- Conservation worker
- Community officer
- Education officer

You could progress to an Apprenticeship at Level 2 by going on to take the Level 2 Diploma in Work-based Environmental Conservation, or to other qualifications at Level 3 such as:

Level 3 Certificate in Countryside Management  
Level 3 Subsidiary Diploma in Countryside Management  
Level 3 90 Credit Diploma in Countryside Management  
Level 3 Diploma in Countryside Management  
Level 3 Extended Diploma in Countryside Management  
Level 3 Diploma in Work-based Environmental Conservation
