OVERVIEW

- What does this qualification cover?

This qualification covers range of areas related to the skills and knowledge required for working in the Equine industry.

All learners will cover the mandatory core units of:

Principles of Maintaining Health and Safety in the Workplace
Maintain Health and Safety in the Workplace
Principles of maintaining good working relations with others
Maintain good working relations with others
Principles of feeding and watering horses
Assist with feeding and watering horses
Principles of grooming and washing horses under direction
Groom and wash horses under direction
Principles of cleaning the stables and yard
Assist with cleaning the stables and yard
Principles of putting on and taking off tack
Assist with putting on and taking off tack
Principles of cleaning tack and horse clothing
Assist with cleaning tack and horse clothing
Principles of putting on and taking off horse rugs
Assist with putting on and taking off horse rugs
Principles of leading and controlling a horse for inspection under direction
Lead and control a horse for inspection under direction
Principles of catching and moving horses under direction
Catch and move horses under direction

Plus these riding units are also mandatory:

Principles of mounting and dismounting quiet horses under supervision
Mount and dismount quiet horses under supervision
Principles of riding horses in an enclosed area
Ride horses in an enclosed area under supervision

This is a Framework qualification.

- Who could take this qualification? OR who is this qualification designed for?

This qualification is available to those entering the industry with limited previous access or experience.

It is a work-related, competence-based qualification, and is designed for someone who wishes to progress into work. It reflects the skills and knowledge needed to do assist with routine jobs effectively.

The qualification may allow you to combine working for a Horse-related business, such as a Riding Stables, Equestrian Centre, Trekking centre or a similar job. This may typically involve you attending one day a week at College or with a Training Provider.

There are no specific prior achievements required to take this qualification, but some experience of working with horses would be considered beneficial.

There are no age restrictions.

WHAT COULD THIS QUALIFICATION LEAD TO?

This qualification could lead to jobs such as:

- Stable Hand
- Yard Worker
- Assistant Groom
- Assistant Trekking centre worker

You could progress to a Level 2 Apprenticeship or other qualifications at Level 2 such as:

Level 2 Certificate, Extended Certificate or Diploma in Horse Care
Level 2 Diploma in Work-based Horse Care
