This is a Framework qualification.







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• Who could take this qualification? OR who is this qualification designed for?

This qualification is part of the Apprenticeship in Fashion and Textiles (saddlery route) or it may be taken as a stand alone qualification.

It is a work-related, competence-based qualification, and is designed for someone in work or who wishes to progress into work. It reflects the skills and knowledge needed to do a job effectively, and shows that you are competent in the area of work the qualification represents.

The qualification may allow you to combine working for a saddlery business or tack shop, and typically involves you attending one day a week at College or with a Training Provider.

There are no specific prior achievements required to take this qualification, but a Level 1 or another Level 2 qualification in Land-based related subjects could be an advantage.

You need to be 16 years old or over to take this qualification.

## WHAT COULD THIS QUALIFICATION LEAD TO?

This qualification could lead to jobs such as:

- Trainee saddler
- Trainee saddle fitter
- Apprentice saddler
- Retail Saddlery assistant
- Saddlery and Leathergoods manufacturer.

You could progress to an Apprenticeship at Level 3 or other qualifications at Level 3 such as:

Level 3 Diploma in Saddlery Level 3 Diploma in Saddle, Harness and Bridle Making (as part of the Apprenticeship in Fashion and Textiles)
