0068 Level 2 Diploma in Work-based Floristry 500/8317/X

OVERVIEW

· What does this qualification cover?

This qualification covers a very wide range of areas related to the skills and knowledge required for working in the Floristry Industry.

All learners will cover the mandatory core units of Identify, check and monitor the quality of incoming cut materials Plan, prepare and construct funeral designs Plan, prepare and construct floral arrangements Plan, prepare and construct tied floristry designs Monitoring and maintaining health and safety

You will then need to take either:

Maintain and develop personal

Establish and maintain effective working relationships with others

You can then take optional units that are relevant to your chosen area of interest/ the type of role that you would be interested in, such as Plan, prepare and construct wedding designs with floral materials, Identify and maintain the condition of plants and planted designs, Plan, prepare and construct wedding designs with floral materials or Give customers a positive impression of yourself and your organisation. The choice of optional units will reflect the work environment that you are in, and the type of role that you are carrying out.

This is a Framework qualification.

Who could take this qualification? OR who is this qualification designed for?

This qualification is part of the Apprenticeship in Floristry, or it may be taken as a stand alone qualification.

It is a work-related, competence-based qualification, and is designed for someone in work or who wishes to progress into work. It reflects the skills and knowledge needed to do a job effectively, and shows that you are competent in the area of work the qualification represents.









The qualification may allow you to combine working in a Florist Shop, and typically involves you attending one day a week at College or with a Training Provider.

There are no specific prior achievements required to take this qualification, but a Level 1 or another Level 2 qualification in Floristry or other Land-based related subjects could be an advantage.

You need to be 16 years old or over to take this qualification.

WHAT COULD THIS QUALIFICATION LEAD TO?

This qualification could lead to jobs such as:

- Junior Florist
- Florist

You could progress to an Apprenticeship at Level 3 or other qualifications at Level 3 such as:

Level 3 Award in Floristry Level 3 Certificate in Floristry Level 3 Diploma in Floristry Level 3 Diploma in Work-based Floristry

There is only the Diploma at Level 2 in Work-based Floristry. There are no smaller qualifications. If you want to do an Apprenticeship at Level 2, you must take the Diploma qualification.
