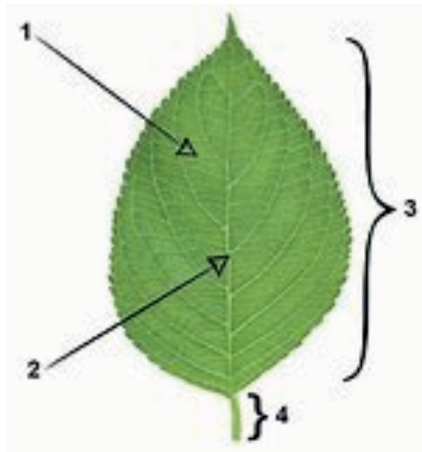

- Source a local landscaper for a quote for levelling an area of the site prior to establishing a sensory garden.
