City & Guilds Level 3 Advanced Technical Extended Diploma in Horticulture (Professional Horticulture) (1080)

We feel that the above qualification would provide young people with necessary skills and knowledge required to potentially work in a job as a Landscape Site Manager/Foreman.

The skills that are important for this type of role, and are within the qualification, include:

- Safe working practices in Horticulture
- Being able to identify, select and plant a range of plants
- Safe use and operation of machinery
- Plant health and protection
- Maintaining turf
- Business skills
- Undertaking tree and shrub maintenance
- Knowledge of plant and soil science
- Constructing horizontal landscape surfaces
- Constructing and maintaining timber landscape features
- Constructing and restoring walls
- Constructing and maintaining decorative landscape features
- Preparing landscape and garden design briefs
- Undertaking site surveying, levelling and setting out
- Using computer aided design in horticulture
- Producing specifications, undertaking and monitoring landscape projects
- Knowledge of advanced horticultural science
- Undertake a specific project
