Level 2 Diploma for Proficiency in Fish and Shellfish Industry Skills (600/3978/4)

<u>OVERVIEW</u>

What does this qualification cover?

This qualification moves on from the Level 2 Certificate for proficiency in fish and shellfish industry skills by introduction more advanced skills associated with fish and shellfish processing operations and also introduces concepts of continuous improvement and monitoring of production lines processes.

There is a large volume of units within this qualification covering every aspect of the fish and shellfish production line processes, from the receipt and storage of raw products, through to the various production lines processes associated with various fish and shellfish, right through to packaging and transportation of products and finally through to the sale of products.

You will take a mixture of mandatory and optional units depending on their role within the fish and shellfish production line process.

This is a Framework qualification.

Who could take this qualification?

This qualification is suitable if you wish to pursue a career in the fish and shellfish industry either in a production line or sales role. Ideally you should already have taken the Level 2 Certificate for proficiency in fish and shellfish industry skills (600/3978/4) or have a basic understanding of basic fish and shellfish operations.

You need to be 16 years old or over to take this qualification.







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WHAT COULD THIS QUALIFICATION LEAD TO?

This qualification could lead to jobs such as:

- Sales/Service Support Assistant (Fish and Shellfish)
- Fishmonger
- Fish/Shellfish Processing Operative
- Team leader
