OVERVIEW

What does this qualification cover?

This qualification covers the advanced practical skills and knowledge required to work in traditional upholstery roles within the furnishings industry

You will take the following mandatory units

- Health and safety within furniture and furnishing making environments
- Traditional furniture upholstery
- Production planning in furniture and furnishing making
- Restoration of traditional furniture upholstery
- Supervision in a furniture and furnishing making environment

And then choose from the following optional units

- Produce drawings using CAD
- Prototype design in modern upholstery

This is a Framework qualification.

Who could take this qualification?

This qualification is suitable if you wish to pursue a career in traditional upholstery roles within the furnishings industry. Ideally you should already have completed the Level 2 Diploma in Furnishings – Traditional Upholstery (600/3193/1) qualification or have an understanding of basic traditional upholstery skills.

This qualification is suitable if you are aged 14 years old or over.



WHAT COULD THIS QUALIFICATION LEAD TO?

This qualification could lead to jobs such as:

- Mattress Maker
- Soft Furnisher
- Upholsterer (including Cutter & Sewer)
- Designer Maker (Bespoke Craft)

You could progress onto the 'Furniture, furnishings and interiors' apprenticeship or the following Institute of Leadership and Management (ILM) qualifications:

- Level 3 Award in First Line Management (500/3586/1)
- Level 3 Diploma in First Line Management (500/3587/3)
- Level 3 Certificate in First Line Management (500/3585/X)
