Write a letter to the manager to explain:


- why you want them to visit

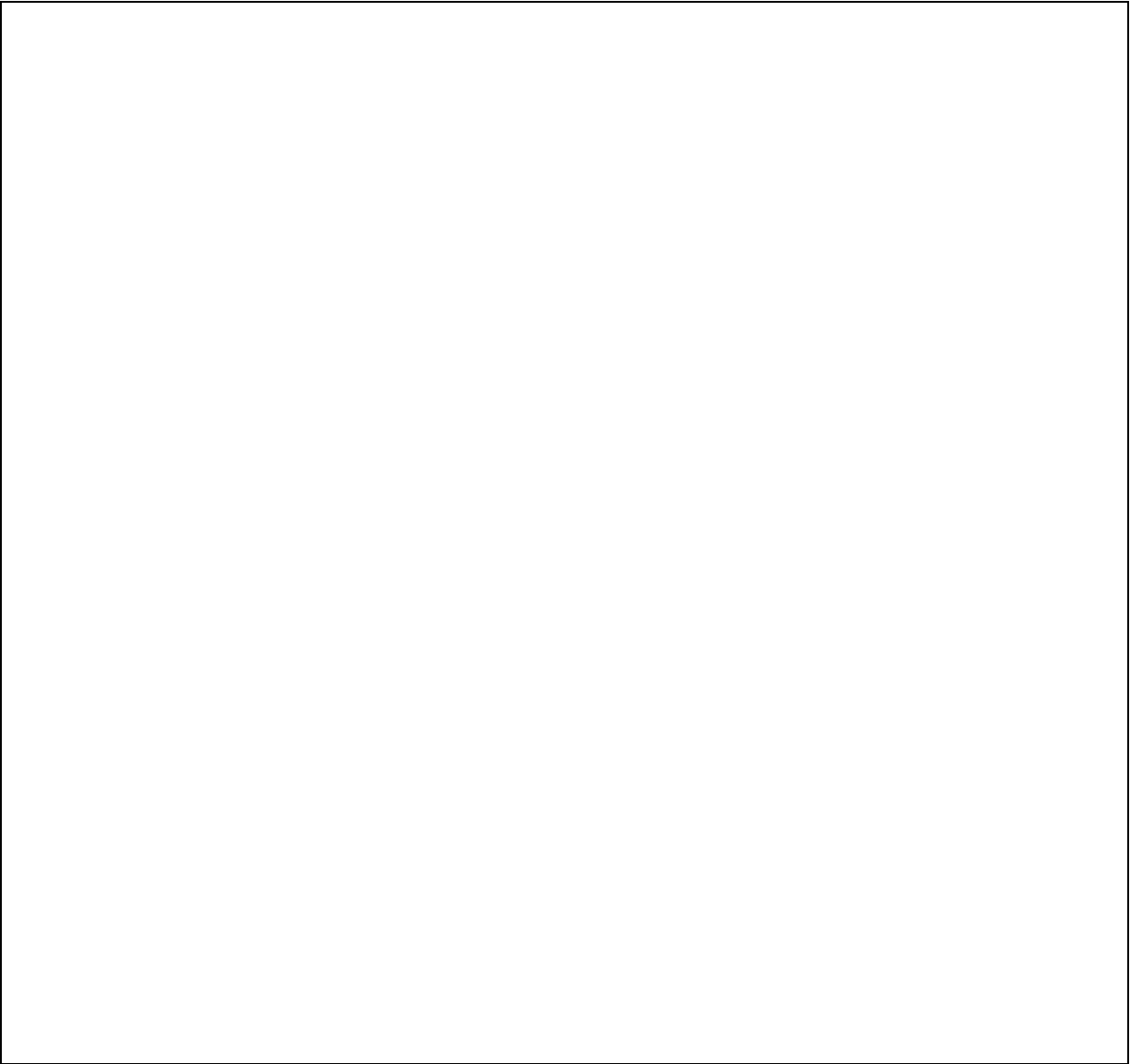

- format suitable for a story (e.g. title).

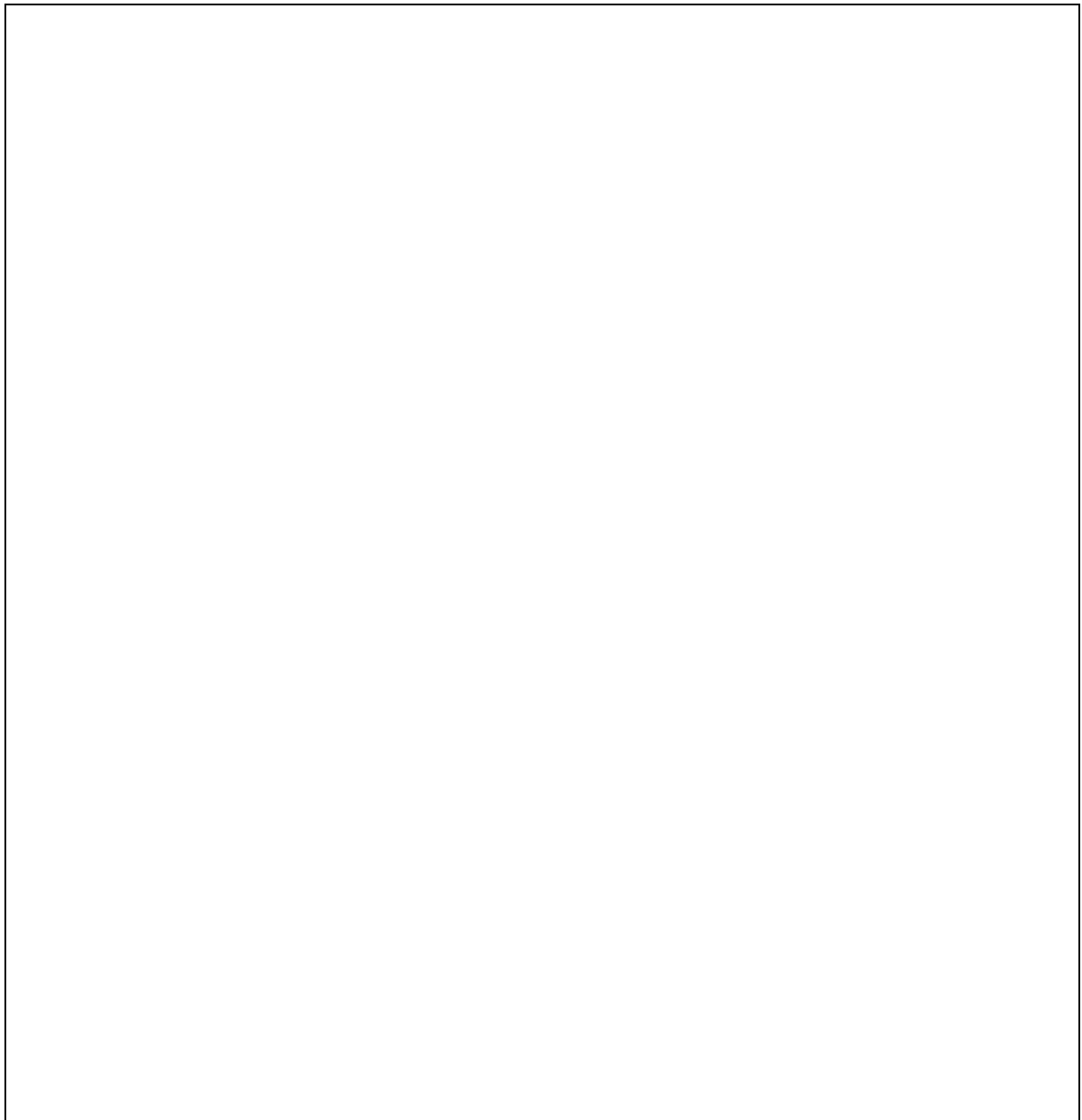
