# Development of new qualifications for MOT Testers (including Motorcycle) and Authorised Examiner/Designated Managers (England, Wales and Scotland)

We are pleased to announce that the NOS for MOT Testers and Managers have been approved for all nations.

We are now working with DVSA to develop qualifications for these occupational roles.

From September 2016, anyone who wants to become a MOT tester or an Authorised Examiner/Designated Manager will need to achieve a qualification to apply for their licence.

The CPD requirements to maintain their licence are also changing. MOT testers will have to keep their CPD up to date with a minimum of 16 hours' learning over a rolling five year period with no fewer than three hours in any given year.

Every year, DVSA will publish the syllabus of the CPD that MOT testers will have to meet during the year. MOT testers will have to keep evidence of at least three hours of training/self learning spent on ensuring they have the knowledge set up in the syllabus. In addition, there will be an online exam covering the syllabus that would have to be successfully achieved.

We are working with DVSA in the development of the new process by September 2016. In order to ensure a smooth transition, we will carry out a pilot of the qualifications and CPD programme during March 2016-September 2016.
