New Modern Apprenticeship Frameworks for Light Vehicle and Heavy Vehicle

As you may know from our previous communication, in order to allow for a smooth transition from current Modern Apprenticeship Framework to the new ones, the current Light Vehicle and Heavy Vehicle qualifications have been extended until **30 November 2016**.

These Modern Apprenticeship Frameworks for Light Vehicle and Heavy Vehicle are replaced by the new Modern Apprenticeship Frameworks from **beginning of December 2016**.

The City & Guilds' qualification numbers in the new frameworks are:

4310-23	SVQ 3 in Heavy Vehicle Maintenance and Repair at SCQF Level 7	4310-53
4390-12	Diploma Light Vehicle Maintenance and Repair SCQF Level 5	4390-42
4390-13	Diploma Light Vehicle Maintenance and Repair SCQF Level 7	4390-43
4390-22	Diploma Heavy Vehicle Maintenance and Repair SCQF Level 5	4390-52
4390-23	Diploma Heavy Vehicle Maintenance and Repair SCQF Level 5	4390-53

For centres who are registering candidates on all other pathways such as Vehicle Accident Repair Body and Paint, the existing qualifications still remain the same and can continue to be used for registration.

Approval process for the new Light Vehicle and Heavy Vehicle qualifications

Centres approved to offer the current **SVQs in Maintenance and Repair** (4310-12, -34 in light vehicle and 4310-22, -23 in the heavy vehicle) may apply for approval for these new qualifications using the fast track approval form available from the City & Guilds' website.

It is important that centres inform us via the fast track form whether they intend to deliver the new optional units for hybrids and electric vehicles, as this will inform the approval process.

Fast track approval is available for 12 months from the launch of the qualification. After this time, the qualification is subject to the standard Qualification Approval Process. It is the centre's responsibility to check that fast track approval is still current at the time of application'.

In regards to the **Diplomas in Maintenance and Repair** (4390-12, -13 for light vehicle and 4390-22, -23 for heavy vehicle), they are almost identical so we would provide centres with automatic approval.

Consultation on Body and Paint SCQF Qualifications

Currently the qualifications for Body and Paint are being reviewed. If you would like to receive the documents with the amendments, please e-mail automotive@cityandguilds.com

In addition, IMI Sector Skills Council are looking at holding a meeting on Tuesday 13th December in Glasgow, Scotland (address to be confirmed) to credit rate the L6 Body qualifications.
