- What does this qualification cover?

This qualification is aimed at train drivers who want to prove their competence driving and/or operating trains in accordance with rules and procedures to high standards of safety and customer service

The key activities addressed by this qualification are:

- Prepare to undertake duties in the rail industry
- Maintain a safe and secure working environment in the rail industry
- Obtain and communicate information in the rail industry
- Maintain effective working relationships with colleagues in the rail industry
- Maintain and develop personal knowledge, understanding and skills in the rail industry
- Bring trains into service
- Operate and control trains in service
- Respond to abnormal working conditions in the rail industry
- Handover and dispose of trains.

This is a Framework qualification.

- Who could take this qualification?

Train Drivers who want to prove they have the skills and knowledge required to carry out their job in their workplace at the standard expected.

WHAT COULD THIS QUALIFICATION LEAD TO?

Learners will be able to progress into a supervisory or managerial role, where they will be able to prove competence by taking up the 600/2650/9 Level 3 NVQ Diploma in Rail Services.

In addition, they could also move onto a higher level qualification through the Institute of Leadership and Management (ILM) to progress even further into a leadership and management role.
