Independent end assessment	The Property Maintenance Operative Apprenticeship end assessment will consist of an end knowledge assessment and a practical task with a professional discussion to ensure the learner is fully tested on all technical competencies required to be competent at the role. The independent assessment model is yet to be finalised and will either be assessed on a 1-1 basis or in groups depending on the type of practical tasks the employer decides are appropriate. They will grade the learner overall as Pass or Distinction.



LEARNING AND FORMATIVE ASSESSMENT




Assessment Gateway
Employer and/or Training Provider comments & sign off to support evidence in interview & confirm ready for end assessment. Apprentice deemed to be ready for the Summative Assessment.

Apprentice: carries out work as defined by their employer, selects evidence for their portfolio from work carried out to progress through gateway and completes the Knowledge Modules.

Employer: creates opportunities for the apprentice to carry out work and produce outcomes; confirms that apprentice is ready for summative assessment

Training Provider: maps and assesses work against the Standard, confirms readiness for summative assessment

END ASSESSMENT



Apprentice: Completes knowledge assessment and practical task(s) and attends interview

Independent Assessor: assesses and grades the apprentice on the basis of practical task(s) and interview

Independent Moderation: quality controls the independent assessment service
